THE MAYOR'S MESSAGE



Greetings to my fellow residents of Penbrook.

Since the last newsletter, I have had the privilege of attending events in the Borough, such as the St. Margaret

Mary's 5K run and the opening day ceremony of the Penbrook Athletic Association. Another event that I attended was the 1st Charter Night for the Penbrook Leos Club. These teens continue to provide community service wherever they can. Dignitaries from all levels of the Lions organization were present at this event and they all share my thoughts about our Leos Club being a great asset to our community. My greatest joy, however, is seeing these teens involved in their community and possessing the pride of being a team working for good causes, instead of being involved with crime, drugs and gangs, like so many youth these days.

In order to keep our police department on top of any situation encountered, we are pursuing grants for training and equipment. We have already been approved for a grant covering most of the cost of a new full-time officer for two years. We will fill this position as soon as possible. At the May council meeting, council approved my recommendation to hire two part-time officers. I have sworn these officers in and they will be filling gaps in coverage. My goal is to get as much funding as possible from sources other than the Borough treasury to lighten our taxpayers' burden while we fight crime.

ORDINANCE 2010-2

The following, in part, is taken from Ordinance 2010-2...

Section 1. Adding to the end of Section 266-69 of the Codification Ordinances of the Borough of Penbrook the following words:

“(17) One non-commercial sign consistent with other regulations herein as to size, height, illumination and placement, up to 16 square feet which expresses opinion or political view or belief is permitted.”

Section 2. Deleting 266-17(A) in its entirety and adding thereto the following:

“Section 266-17 Fences and Walls

A. Fences and walls may be erected, altered and maintained within the side or rear yard with no set back provided that any fence or wall not exceed six (6) feet in height and may be erected, altered and maintained shall not violate any other provisions of the Borough Ordinances and fences within the front yard may be erected, altered and maintained with no set back but shall not exceed three (3) feet and shall not violate any other provisions of the Borough Ordinances.”

Be sure to contact the Borough Office before erecting any fences.

LITTLE VALLEY PARKS PROGRAM

The **Little Valley Park Program** will begin June 28 and run Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays for four weeks, ending July 23, with the exception of Friday, July 2 and Monday, July 5. Last year's volunteer program worked so well, it will be repeated this year.

FIRE PREVENTION

PICK A SAFE GRILLING AREA

- Place your grill on a flat, level surface so it won't tip over. Keep it away from overhangs, fences, deck railings and shrubbery that could be ignited by a sudden flare-up or flying spark.
- Position the grill in a well-ventilated location. Never barbecue inside homes, tents, or vehicles. Burning charcoal inside can kill you. It gives off carbon monoxide, which has no odor.
- Keep children and pets away from the grill when it's in use.

HANDLE CHARCOAL CAREFULLY

- Never add lighter fluid directly to hot coals to get a sluggish fire going again. The flame could travel up the stream of fluid and burn you.
- If coals are slow to start, place several new briquets in a small metal can and apply lighter fluid following lighter fluid instructions. Add these briquets, using a pair of long-handled tongs, to warm coals and light with a match.
- Never use gasoline or kerosene to light a charcoal fire. Both can cause an explosion.

- Do not close the lid until you are ready to cook. Doing so might put out the fire or cause a rush of flame when the lid is removed. Closing the lid prematurely also can prevent charcoal lighter fluid from completely burning away, giving foods a strange taste.

- **Coals are HOT** – they can reach up to 1000°F. Use insulated, flame-retardant mitts when cooking or handling any part of the grill. Also, use long-handled barbecue tongs and utensils for safe handling of food and coals.

- **Smoke the Competition.** When smoking meat, pay special attention to controlling internal grill temperature. For an accurate reading, place a candy thermometer's probe through the top grill vent and maintain a temperature of about 225 to 250°F. If the temperature rises above this range, slide the vent directly under the charcoal nearly closed while wearing heat-protective gloves. Continue to monitor the heat and open the vent again as the temperature drops.

PUTTING OUT THE FIRE

- Place the cover on the grill, close the vents and allow the coals to burn out completely. Let the ashes cool for at least 48 hours and then dispose of them in a non-combustible container.
- If you must dispose of coals before they've completely cooled, remove them individually with long-handled tongs and carefully bury them in a can of sand or in a bucket of water. Never pour the hot coals into a pail of water, or vice versa. Steam from the briquets may burn you.

STORING COALS

- Store briquets in a cool, dry area of the basement or garage. When charcoal absorbs moisture, it can be hard to light.
- For instant-lighting charcoal, keep bag tightly closed to prevent lighter fluid from evaporating.

HANDICAPPED PARKING

Borough residents who have been granted "Handicapped Parking" signs are asked to notify the Borough Office when moving or when signs are no longer needed.

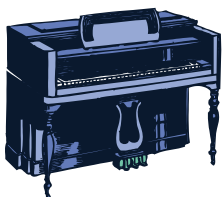
