At the February Borough Council Meeting, **Officer Ronald Frederick** received an award from Chief David Bogdanovic of Swatara Township Police for his assistance in the September 2009 capture of an armed domestic violence offender in Swatara Township. Frederick's efforts were instrumental, not only in the capture of the suspect, but also in recovery of the suspect's gun. During the chase and manhunt the suspect abandoned the gun in a public area. Failure to recover the weapon would have created a dangerous situation where anyone, including children, could have discovered the firearm. ## FIRE PREVENTION

### **Extension Cords Safety Suggestions**

- Make sure cords do not dangle from the counter or table tops where they can be pulled down or tripped over.
- Replace cracked or worn extension cords with new, #16 gauge cords that have the listing of a nationally-recognized testing laboratory, safety closures, and other safety features.
- Check the plug and the body of the extension cord while the cord is in use. Noticeable warming of these plastic parts is expected when cords are being used at their maximum rating, however, if the cord plastic is hot, this is a warning that the plug wires or connections are failing and that the extension cords should be discarded and replaced.
- Never use an extension cord while it is coiling or looped. Never cover any part of an extension cord with newspapers, clothing, rugs, or any objects while the cord is in use. Never place an extension cord where it is likely to be damaged by heavy furniture or foot traffic.

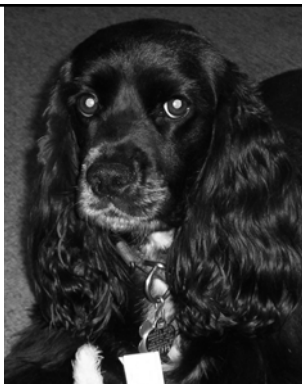

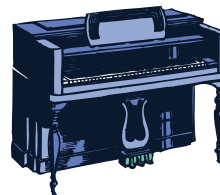

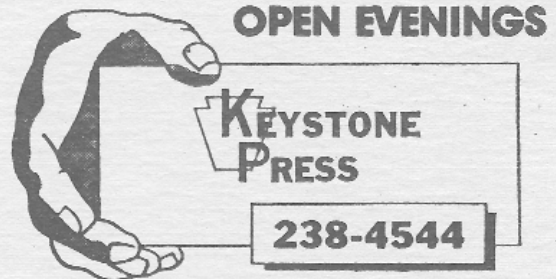
