## AN OPEN LETTER TO THE RESIDENTS OF PENBROOK

---

Dear Neighbors,

I'm sure you've seen reports on the TV and in the newspapers, and signs placed around the Borough talking about code violations. You should know that all of this is being caused by three absentee landlords. All three have been sent citations for violating the Penbrook Borough Code. Two refused to pay their business taxes as landlords and one received a property violation. None of these people live with us in the Borough.

Why are they unhappy and causing such a stir? Because they want you to believe that the Borough has treated them unfairly, and you may be next. They have unjustly accused members of Borough Council of using citations to increase Borough coffers. The truth is that the Borough never issues violation notices without first determining that a violation of the code has occurred. These situations lower the quality of life in the Borough and create an atmosphere where crime can thrive. If a property owner continues to ignore the law, even after several notices are sent, the Borough has no choice but to issue a citation. Once these are issued, 80% or more of those who receive them fix the violation. When a violation is corrected, the Borough routinely withdraws the citation. Only those property owners who continue to refuse to obey the law end up in court.

The recently formed Penbrook Landlords Association has told the Borough Council, in a public meeting as recently as February 28, 2011, that they DO NOT support this litigation against the Borough. They feel the banners and the litigation drag down property values and they are very concerned. So, what has all this cost you, the taxpayer??? The answer is NOTHING! The litigation is being vigorously fought by attorneys for our insurance companies. While it is the policy of the Borough Council not to comment on pending litigation I can only say that I believe that the allegations are baseless and that Dauphin County Court will shortly dismiss them.

I hope you understand why it has been necessary to fight to have our ordinances enforced. To do otherwise would mean we all would be living with trash throughout the Borough and scofflaws who refuse to pay their fair share of taxes, leaving you to pick up the slack. Thank you for your support during these troubling and difficult times

## OFFICER ASSUMES DUTIES OF LIEUTENANT



At the February 2, 2011 Regular Council Meeting, **Stephan A. Mowery** was publicly sworn in as **Lieutenant** of the Penbrook Police Department. Mowery was hired as a Penbrook Police Officer in January 1988. Since that time he has served as a patrol officer, detective, vice detective and crime scene and forensics specialist.

Due to the ever-increasing demands of managing a Police Department, Mayor Cramer recommended to Borough Council, and Council agreed, to appoint a Lieutenant. After a thorough examination of several well-qualified members of the Police Department, Mowery was appointed to the newly formed position.

## UPDATE FROM THE STATE HOUSE



I am pleased to provide the residents of Penbrook and the 104th Legislative District an update from the state House of Representatives.

With the 2011-12 legislative well under way in the state Capitol, the House has been focused on several reform measures including, House Bill 15 would create an Internet-based, searchable database for all state spending known; House Bill 103 would increase penalties on those in violation of the Lobbyist Disclosure Act; House Bill 104 and House Bill 105 would extend whistleblower protections to employees of the General Assembly, and those under contract with the Commonwealth; House Bill 107 would ban an individual, working for state government and who has been employed by a prospective contractor within the previous two years, from participating in the evaluation of contract proposals; House Bill 108 would apply the Right-To-Know Law to allow for public inspection of no-bid, non-competitive state government contracts; and House Bill 109 would prohibit members of the General Assembly from creating or maintaining non-profit organizations that receive public funds.

Also of great importance is the upcoming state budget for fiscal year 2011-12, which begins July 1, 2011. At this point, the Commonwealth is facing a nearly \$4 billion deficit, which is a direct result of the loss of nearly \$3 billion in federal stimulus funds and \$750 million of one-time revenues used in the current budget. Tough and unpopular decisions will need to be made in the ensuing months; however, it is necessary to ensure the financial health and
